Key Vocabulary: doctor, nurse, police, fire service, emergency, community, paramedic, ambulance

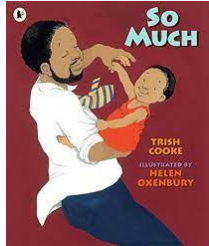
