



HOW DO I TELL ONCE UPON A TIME STORIES?

This project supports children to develop a love of stories and reading, mapping the stories to produce simple picture maps. It encourages children to learn, retell and act out familiar and traditional tales including The Gingerbread Man, The Three Little Pigs, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, and Little Red Riding Hood. Through these stories it also explores the properties of different materials and what happens when they change state and gives a glimpse into some historical artefacts.




